

Planning Commission — Upcoming Meetings

• April 18, 7:00 p.m. — Planning Commission Meeting: The Commission will hold a public hearing to consider recommending adoption of an "all-electric" building requirement for certain new types of construction (as previously directed by City Council at its February 8, 2022, meeting). This meeting will be conducted as a "hybrid meeting": for the first time in over two years, the Commission, staff, and public will be able to meet together in person in Council Chambers; an online (Zoom) forum will also be in place to accommodate remote participants.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations

Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks, buildings, and sewer lift stations. They cleaned up numerous illegal dumping and graffiti throughout town. A \$50K contract to repair sidewalk tripping hazards at various locations was completed. The trees were trimmed around the Refugio Tennis Courts and the landscape screening project around the Corporation Yard has begun.

Engineering

The design plans are under review for the Sycamore Crossing development project, including the EBMUD relocation of the waterline into San Pablo Avenue and hotel. City is waiting for permits from regulatory agencies so the Sycamore Trunk Sewer Replacement Project can be bid out. This project will replace a long segment of sewer trunk main leading into the Pinole-Hercules Water Pollution Control Plant. Design on the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center (RITC) is advancing utilizing \$1.2M in grant funding and the City has



contracted with GBS to develop a funding plan to complete the project. The sewer conveyance system for the Willow Storage Facility Developer is under review. The Sycamore Avenue Rehabilitation Project and Palm/Willow Sidewalk Project is in final design and staff is pushing hard for the project to be ready for construction this coming season.


