



Housing Element Update



Following the first community workshop held on March 21, the City held the second virtual workshop for the Housing Element Update on April 25. You can watch a video recording of the meeting and download the presentation at the Housing Element webpage. Now that the City has gotten initial feedback from the Community on housing concerns and preferences for how to address those concerns, City staff and consultants are drafting the Housing Element document, which should be available by June for 30 days of public review.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Maintenance & Operations

Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks, buildings, and sewer lift stations. They cleaned up numerous illegal dumping and graffiti throughout town and trimmed vegetation on streets as needed for visibility. The landscape screening project around the Corporation Yard is underway and sidewalks are being identified for repair.

Engineering

The design plans are under review for the Sycamore Crossing development project, including the EBMUD relocation of the waterline into San Pablo Avenue and hotel. City is waiting for permits from regulatory agencies so the Sycamore Trunk Sewer Replacement Project can be bid out. This project will replace a long segment of sewer trunk main leading into the Pinole-Hercules Water Pollution Control Plant. Design on the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center (RITC) is advancing utilizing \$1.2M in grant funding and the City has contracted with GBS who is developing a funding plan to complete the project. A grant application for \$7M to complete the RITC was submitted to Congressman Mike Thompson's office. The sewer conveyance system for the Willow Storage Facility Developer is under review. The Sycamore Avenue Rehabilitation Project and Palm/Willow Sidewalk Project is in final design and staff is pushing hard for the project to be ready for construction this coming season.






