# Help Shape Hercules' Waterfront!

Join the Waterfront Blocks ABCD Community Workshop



The City of Hercules is seeking community input on the future development of a vacant site along the western shore of Hercules. This vacant site consists of Blocks ABCD (aka "The Heights" or "The Bowl") of the Waterfront District Master Plan (WDMP). Ledcor, a residential developer and also the developer of The Exchange and The Grand in the Bayfront project, has submitted an initial development proposal for Blocks ABCD. The development proposal includes a mostly residential community with 142 residential townhouses, parks, and some mixed use. However, the proposal does not align with the design and development regulations of the City's WDMP.

You are invited to attend either of two community workshops, one virtual and one in-person, to learn more about Ledcor's Proposal and background on the Waterfront District Master Plan and its planning process. Both workshops will include the same presentation, an opportunity to ask questions, engage in discussion and provide feedback.

# PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

### Maintenance & Operations

Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks, buildings, and sewer lift stations. They cleaned up numerous illegal dumping and graffiti throughout town and trimmed vegetation on streets as needed for visibility. The landscape screening project around the Corporation Yard was completed, sidewalks were identified for repair throughout town, an emergency repair was made to the water line for the Senior Center, and the construction contract for the Baywood Tree Replacement project was executed with work scheduled to begin in June.

### Engineering

The design plans are under review for the Sycamore Crossing development project, including the EBMUD relocation of the waterline into San Pablo Avenue and hotel. City is waiting for permits from regulatory agencies so the Sycamore Trunk Sewer Replacement Project can be bid out. This project will replace a long segment of sewer trunk main leading into the Pinole-Hercules Water Pollution Control Plant. Design on the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center (RITC) is advancing utilizing \$1.2M in grant funding and the City has contracted with GBS who is developing a funding plan to complete the project. The sewer conveyance system for the Willow Storage Facility Developer is under review. The Sycamore Avenue Rehabilitation Project and Palm/Willow Sidewalk Project are in final design and staff is pushing hard for the projects to be ready for construction this coming season.

### Water Safety Month

Swim lessons are a great way to learn about water safety skills. Some of the skills they will learn are how to enter and exit the water safely, understanding the pool rules, how to recognize the lifeguard and to call

out for help. These are just some of the skills to get started on your journey to water safety. Red Cross has more teaching tools and water safety information.

- Pool rules: make sure you know the pool rules and follow them. Listen to when a lifeguard/water watcher enforces the rules.
- Throw don't go, if you see someone that need assistance find something that floats to throw to them.
- Buddy system, it is important to never swim alone.
- Make sure you wear a U.S Coast Guard lifejacket/personal flotation device correctly.
- Wear your sun protection, sunscreen, hats, sunglasses, sun shirts, etc. Bring lots of water to stay hydrated.


