Star Gazing

Hercules resident, Dave Harris, is once again offering the Public Stargazing Program at Foxboro Park. The next star gazing event will be held on Saturday, June 25, on the tennis courts at Foxboro Park. This date is nearest the last quarter moon, maximizing the view of stellar objects. The program time is from dusk until approximately 11:30pm. More than 40% cloud cover or worse (i.e. rain, high winds) would cancel the program for this date. All ages are welcome. If you plan recommended join the star gazing, it is that you dress warmly.

For those star gazing devotees, be advised that there is going to be a planetary alignment in June that will allow people to see five planets: Mercury, Venus, Mars, Saturn, and Jupiter, which last occurred in 2004 and won't happen again until 2040. The best time to see this alignment is shortly before sunrise.

Code Enforcement Division

Code Enforcement staff investigate and follow up on requests for enforcement of the Zoning Code. Residents are encouraged to use the **Hercules Connect** app, available on the <u>Apple App Store</u> and <u>Google Play Store</u>, to place requests for code enforcement. The app allows you to track a request and see when it has been acknowledged or closed.

Code Enforcement staff visit the site of all requests and attempt to contact the property owner or occupant, leaving literature behind to explain the relevant code provisions. If an issue is not corrected promptly, a courtesy Warning Notice may be issued, followed by a formal Notice to Abate with a deadline for correction. If the deadline is not met, an Administrative Citation may be issued to the property owner. Repeated or unpaid citations will result in escalating fines that could be assessed against the property if not paid.

In the past two weeks, the Division received 9 new enforcement requests and closed 3 requests.

- All-Electric Building Ordinance. At its June 14 meeting, the Council approved the second reading of the All-Electric Building Ordinance Amendments to the Hercules Municipal Code, Title 9 Building Regulations, modifying Chapter 5 Electrical Code, as approved at the first reading on May 24.
- **Housing Element Update.** At its June 14 meeting, the City Council received an update on the ongoing preparation of the City's draft Housing Element Update. A <u>public draft</u> was released for comment by June 17, after which the draft will be submitted to the state Department of Housing and Community Development for their review and comment.

development proposal includes a mostly residential community 142 residential with townhouses, parks, and some mixed use. However, Ledcor proposal does not align with the design development regulations from the form-based code of the City's Waterfront District Master Plan (WDMP), shown in the illustration at left.



Maintenance & Operations

Staff completed their regularly scheduled custodial and facility-related tasks in public parks, buildings, and sewer lift stations. They cleaned up numerous illegal dumping and graffiti throughout town and trimmed vegetation on streets as needed for visibility. Staff removed a tree branch blocking sidewalk along Pheasant, help coordinate work with contractors on both seasonal Weed abatement and preparation for 4rth of July Fireworks and spent time preparing for this weekend's Household Hazardous waste event at the Corporation yard. Staff coordinated with Pacific Site, the contractor, on the Baywood Tree Replacement project which is anticipated to start mid-June.




Engineering

The design plans are under review for the Sycamore Crossing development project, including the EBMUD relocation of the waterline into San Pablo Avenue and hotel. City is finally received permits from regulatory agencies so the Sycamore Trunk Sewer Replacement Project can now be bid out. This project will replace a long segment of sewer trunk main leading into the Pinole-Hercules Water Pollution Control Plant. Design on the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center (RITC) is advancing utilizing \$1.2M in grant funding and the City has contracted with GBS who is developing a funding plan to complete the project. The sewer conveyance system for the Willow Storage Facility Developer is under review. The Sycamore Avenue Rehabilitation Project is being bid out with an anticipated Council award date at the second meeting in July. Staff is reviewing a surcharge grading permit for what known as the "Bowl" or Blocks ABCD located at the corner of Bayfront and Railroad. This area is part of the Bayfront Development and while the soil preparation is underway a project has not yet been approved for this site.


