Shoplifting: On June 7, 2023, at approximately 8:59 AM, Officers were dispatched to Lucky for a report of a theft that had just occurred. The reporting party stated an adult male, with a backpack, had just stolen beer and was walking towards McDonalds. Officers arrived on scene and contacted a 31 year old male, of Rodeo, inside the McDonalds. The subject was found to be on Parole. The Lucky employee positively identified the subject as the male who stole the merchandise. The merchandise was located with the subject.
