**Towed Vehicle:** On October 20, 2023, at 11:15 am, an officer conducted a traffic stop on a 2012 GMC Canyon, at the 76 Gas Station. The vehicle had a nonoperational status dated 10/13/2022. The vehicle was towed for being driven on the roadway with expired registration over 6 months. The driver was identified as a 58 year old male, out of Stockton.

**Annoying or Harassing and Threatening Text Messages:** On October 20, 2023, at 4:23 pm, an officer was dispatched to a lobby detail regarding threatening and harassing text messages. The victim stated a 27 year old male has been texting her repeatedly and threatening her with inappropriate unwanted text messages. The victim has a temporary restraining order against the subject, which was issued today, but has not been served. **H23-01046**

**Fire Department Open House:** On October 21, 2023, from 11:00am through 2:00pm there was an open Police Department house at the fire station. Officers rotated through while a Parking Enforcement Officer, and Police Department Volunteers, manned the Hercules Police Booth.

**Lost Property:** On October 21, 2023, at 10:47 am, a citizen came to the Police Department to report she lost her wallet, with her Driver's License in It, sometime yesterday on a walk near Ohlone Park. **H23-01047**

**Warrant Arrest:** On October 21, 2023 at 8:51 PM, an Officer conducted a traffic stop for a traffic violation on a white Infiniti. The 37 year old male driver was determined to have a full extradition warrant out of Virginia. The subject was arrested and transported to the Martinez Detention Facility without incident. **H23-01048**

**Mental Health Evaluation /Supplement:** On October 21, 2023 at 11:15 PM, Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Bayfront for a welfare check. The 27 year old male called PD stating he was going to through drug withdrawals. Officers determined the subject was a danger to himself. While on scene Officers served him with his copy of his Temporary Restraining Order, issued against him October 20, 2023. Th subject was transported to the the County Regional Medical Center. **H23-01049 and H23-01046**

**Illegal Possession/Possession for Sales/Transport, Sell (Marijuana), Possession of a Firearm (Not the registered owner, concealed in vehicle, loaded in a public place):** On October 22, 2023, at 9:43 am, an Officer conducted a traffic stop on a white 2002 Chevy Suburban, on the I80 west onramp from Willow Ave, for vehicle code violations. Upon contacting the occupants, the Officer immediately smelled the strong odor of a fresh, and fresh burnt substance believed to be marijuana, coming from inside the vehicle. The Officer then noticed loose pieces of a leafy green substance, believed to be marijuana, in plain view

scattered on the front passenger floorboard. The Officer also observed paraphernalia, inside the vehicle, consistent with smoking marijuana, and ashes were scattered about the driver and front passenger area. Based on the observations and violations, the Officer conducted a search of the Suburban. The 38 year old male driver, and 31 year old male passenger, were escorted out from the vehicle. The Officer located approximately 10 ounces of suspected marijuana. The substance was divided into three separate glass jars. One of the jars contained four individual sandwich bags filled with suspected marijuana. The Officer also found a loaded handgun inside a bag in the back seat of the Suburban. The firearm contained a fully loaded 14-round magazine. The two subjects were placed under arrest and searched incident to arrest. The driver had a large amount of cash inside the pocket of his shorts, which he was wearing underneath a pair of pants. The passenger was ultimately released from custody pending further investigation. The driver was transported to the Martinez Detention Facility without incident. **(H23-01051)**

**Fighting in Public:** On October 22, 2023, at 6:29 pm, Officers were dispatched to the 800 block of Willow Ave. Officers determined a fight occurred at a party which was held at a local Restaurant. A 27 year old male, and his 30 year old brother and got into a verbal altercation with a group of people attending the party. The group was gone when the Police arrived. It was determined the brothers engaged in mutual combat with the other group just outside the restaurant. Both brothers desired prosecution of the other group for hitting them. An Officer is conducting a follow up investigation. No weapons were used during this incident. **(H23-01052)**

**Service of a Domestic Violence Restraining Order:** On October 22, 2023 at 11:02 PM officers were dispatched to The Grand Apartments (2200 John Muir Parkway) for a report of a male knocking and yelling at the door of an apartment. The 30 year old female caller advised 36 year old male was repeatedly knocking on her door and ringing her doorbell. A records check determined the subject is the restrained party in an unserved Domestic Violence Restraining Order with the female caller as the protected party. Officers detained the subject without incident and served him with the Domestic Violence Restraining Order. The subject was admonished to leave the area and to not return or he would be arrested. A case was taken for documentation purposes and officers observed the subject leave the area in an Uber. **H23-01053**

**Coroners Case:** On October 22, 2023 at 11:51 PM officers were dispatched to the 100 block of Sequoia for a report of an unconscious 86 year old man with no pulse. Officers responded to the scene and began life saving measures until Fire and AMR arrived on scene and took over. The subject was pronounced deceased on scene by paramedics. The coroner released the body to the family. **H23-01054**

**Attempted Home Invasion, Felonious Stalking, Felonious Criminal Threats, DVRO Violation:** On October 23, 2023 at 12:02 AM officers were dispatched back to The Grand Apartments (2200 John Muir Parkway) for a report of a 36 year old male (subject in case H23-01053) attempting to force entry into the apartment. The reporting party advised the subject had returned after Hercules officers left the scene the first time. By the time officers arrived on scene, the subject had fled the scene yet again. The reporting party (victim) answered a phone call from the subject as officers contacted her. Officers heard the subject threatening physical violence to the victim and her teenage son. The front door had sustained damage from the subject's attempted forced entry. The door jam was cracked and nearly broken open. The victim advised she desires prosecution for all charges. Photographs were

taken of all the damage. Officers advised the victim to call immediately should the subject return. **H23-01055**

**Incident # 23-30:** On October 23, 2023 at 4:58 AM officers received a FLOCK ALPR notification of a stolen burgundy Hyundai Tucson driving South on Willow Avenue towards Shell gas. An officer located the vehicle occupied and parked nose into a stall facing the green belt near Round Table Pizza. The officer pinned the Hyundai between the curb, which separates the parking lot from the green belt, and his vehicle. The officer initiated a high risk stop. A male, in his 40s-50s, was seated in the driver seat. An unknown individual was seated in the passenger seat. The driver opened the driver door as the officer gave commands. The driver feigned compliance then quickly drove the stolen Hyundai over a curb. He drove at a high rate of speed through some vegetation, and grass, and down the ramp from Creekside to Sycamore.
