Mental Health Evaluation Hold, Towed Vehicle, 30 Day Hold for Evasion: On December 11, 2023, at 7:42 AM an officer observed a 2016 black Honda Accord parked at Lucky. The officer recognized the vehicle as the one that had failed to yield to an officer during a traffic stop on December 10, 2023. The officer conducted a brief surveillance on the vehicle and observed a 47 year old female, out of Hercules, enter the driver's seat. The subject (SUB) again attempted to evade officers but failed to exit the parking lot due to incoming officers blocking her path of flight with their patrol vehicles. SUB exited her vehicle and charged officers and refused to obey commands to comply. SUB was ultimately detained without incident. A pat search for weapons was conducted upon her person which yielded the recovery of an icpick concealed in her waistband. SUB was combative and non-compliant. SUB was determined to be a danger to others and gravely disabled. SUB was placed on a mental health evaluation hold and transported to the County Regional Medical Center. Officers obtained a statement from SUB where she admitted to evading officers on December 10 during an attempted traffic stop for vehicle code violations. Officers authored a seizure warrant on SUB's vehicle with a 30 day hold for the violation. **H23-01201**

Mental Health Evaluation: On December 11, 2023, at approximately 12:07 AM, an Officer responded to the area of Glenwood for a report of a stolen vehicle. The Officer contacted a 72 year old female, of Hercules, who wished to report her vehicle stolen. After speaking with the subject (SUB), it was determined her Toyota Camry had been towed on November 21, 2023. SUB did not understand and believed it was stolen. SUB's apartment was filled with garbage, no food in the fridge and SUB was unable to give coherent responses to questions by the Officer. The Officer determined SUB was gravely disabled. SUB was transported by AMR to County Regional Medical Center for evaluation. **H23-01202**
