All three were detained and a search of the vehicle was conducted. Multiple packages of suspected marijuana packed for sale was located in the vehicle along with other pills, suspected codeine syrup, suspected ecstasy, and a large amount of cash. All three were arrested and transported to HPD for interviews. It was determined that all the illegal items belonged to SUB 1.
