False Report of an Emergency: On July 31, 2024, at 2:02 pm officers were dispatched to a reported Structure Fire in the 100 block of Meadowlark Dr. Officers and Firefighters arrived on scene and located no fire and no one home. It was determined a 37 year old male, who lives in Rodeo, called and reported the fire because he was concerned about his mother. He reported the fire to get emergency services to respond to check on her. It was determined this was the third time the subject had called reporting a fire at his mother's house, and all the calls were unfounded. A case was taken to be forwarded to the District Attorney's office. **H24-00680**

Traffic Collision: On July 31, 2024, at approximately 4:13 PM, an Officer contacted a 56 year old female, of Rodeo, in the front lobby for a report of a cold collision. The collision occurred on July 30, 2024, on Willow Ave at Canterbury. The female did not request a police report at the time, however the subject later sought medical attention for an injury which reportedly occurred during the accident. She is now requested a police report today. **Case H24-00681**

Possession of Short Barreled Rifle/Unregistered Firearm/Assault Weapon: On July 31, 2024, at 8:34 PM, an Officer conducted a traffic stop on a Nissan Altima for a vehicle code violation. The 20 year old male driver and sole occupant, of Oakland, was contacted. During the contact, Officers observed suspected Marijuana violations, in plain view, in the vehicle. Due to the subject being under 21 and the various Marijuana violations, a probable cause search was conducted of the Nissan. Located in the trunk of the Nissan was a backpack. Inside the backpack was a fully loaded firearm. The firearm had a loaded 30-round magazine inserted, and had a round chambered with the safety off. The firearm was unregistered. Officers located a second loaded magazine, for a different type of handgun. However no other weapon was located. **Case H24-00682**

Occupied Stolen Vehicle: On July 31, 2024, at 9:18 PM, Officers received a Flock Camera notification of a 1999 Lexus sedan, that was reported stolen to Richmond PD on July 31, 2024. Officers located the Lexus as it turned the 700 block of Willow Ave. A traffic stop was conducted. The 34 year old male driver, of Richmond, and a 42 year old male passenger, of Richmond, were detained. It was determined the incident may be a civil issue... The driver requested medical attention and was later transported to a hospital for a Hepatitis-C complaint. The passenger was released on scene and the Lexus was towed, **Case H24-00683**

Residential Burglary: On August 1, 2024, at 1:03 AM, Officers responded to the 100 block of Diamond Ct for a report of a masked subject inside of the home. The owners were reportedly not in the residence. Officers arrived and established a Perimeter along with Pinole PD. A San Pablo PD K9 responded. With the assistance of the K9, the residence was cleared with no suspect(s)+

contacted. A broken rear bathroom window appears to be the point of entry. The loss is undetermined at this time. Interior surveillance footage showed a possible male, wearing a hat and a mask, inside of the residence prior to Officers arrival. The investigation is ongoing
