Commercial Burglary/Outside Assist: On August 15, 2024, at 1:46 AM, Officers were dispatched to an alarm activation at the Franklin Canyon Golf Course. Officers in route to the Golf Course observed a white sedan parked, with the hazard lights on. The vehicle was approximately a half a mile east of the Golf Course parking lot, on the side of eastbound Highway 4. Officers continued the Golf Course building and observed a broken window leading into the rear building Golf shop. Pinole PD Officers, along with a Richmond PD K9 and handler, responded. A third Hercules Officer checked on the vehicle, a white Mercedes Sedan, parked on the side of the highway. The vehicle was unoccupied. The Officer was then flagged down by an adult female, 20 feet off the roadway, for an adult male down and unresponsive. Narcan was administered as the female advised the male is a drug user. AMR arrived almost immediately and began life saving measures. The male was later pronounced deceased by Rodeo Hercules Fire. It was determined the deceased male was located within the County's jurisdiction and the Contra Costa Sheriff's Officers took over the death investigation. Hercules, Pinole and the Richmond K9 cleared the Golf Course building, and no further subjects were located. The owner responded and advised multiple items of Golf merchandise were missing. Officers located a backpack, on Highway 4 near the entrance to the Golf Corse. The backpack contained Golf related merchandise and paperwork from the Golf Course.
