Both Adopt-A-Park and Adopt-A-Trail: Volunteer programs that are offered citywide that assist and offer support with the maintenance and care of neighborhood parks, trails, and other open spaces located in City areas.

Volunteers can do the following (but not limited to):

Pick up debris
Rake leaves
Remove graffiti
Report hazards or illegal behavior
Sweep tennis/basketball courts
Pull weeds
Caring for trees

Volunteers are responsible for:

Volunteers must abide by all park rules and ordinances

Volunteers must notify Staff if resigning

Volunteers must return all supplies upon completing task/duties

Volunteers must keep track of hours that they work at various locations and turn it into Staff

Volunteers should report any hazardous material to City Staff. Please do not pick up hazardous items

Volunteers need to report all accidents involving injury or equipment damage to their group leader and City Staff

Volunteers should work in pairs or groups when possible

If working alone, you must be an adult (18 years or older) and always, let the group leader know your location

Volunteers should not operate machinery or dangerous equipment

The City of Hercules Recreation Department provides the following support items:

Gloves and garbage bags

Minimum Commitment:

1 year service of commitment is asked from volunteers to your adopted park or trail. Volunteers are asked to volunteer at their respected location at least once a month.

Training:

Once your adoption is approved by the Community and Library Services Commission, City staff will train the leader of the group or individual to do the tasks that have been stated upon their approval.

Volunteers are required to read, understand, and follow the Safety Guidelines and must follow all park and trail rules and ordinances.

Once your group is trained you will then be considered active volunteers.

Schedule:

Once your adoption is approved by the Community and Library Services Commission and you are trained the group must then provide a list to City Staff of dates as well as a schedule of when they will be going to the appropriate locations to participate in this program.

Recognition:

An official Certificate of Adoption

Recognition on the City website for work completed

Recognition at a Community & Library Services Commission meeting for work completed

Recognition at a City Council meeting for work completed

How to Sign Up:

Print and fill out the Adoption Application

Print and fill out the *Volunteer Service Agreement* for the Group Leader and any other initial group members. Volunteers under the age of 18 years of age must use the *Volunteer Service Agreement* form and must have a parent/guardian signature.
